Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you have had a lovely Easter holiday and we welcome you back to the Summer term! The aim of this letter is outline some of the key aspects of school life in Y2 in the Spring Term so you can support your child both at home and at school.

Our Topics:

Our topics this term are 'There's no Place Like Home' which is primarily geography and in Summer 2 our topic will be 'Turrets and Tiaras' – Kings, Queens and Castles which has more of a history focus.

Art: The children will explore and create maps through various art forms, including drawing, felt making, printmaking, and designing stained glass. The children will develop skills in sorting, designing, and evaluating art. They will be encouraged to present and discuss their creations in a class gallery setting.

Science: Our science topic for the Summer term is 'Plants'. The children will be learning about plants and their lifecycle, further comparing different plants. The children will have the opportunity to explore plants through experimenting with seeds, planting and looking into different variables. Later in the Summer term students will be learning about 'Animals; Including humans'. They will explore how animals change as they grow up and be introduced to the life cycles of different animals.

Other learning this term:

English – The children will be developing a variety of reading and writing skills around the text 'The Minpins' by Roald Dahl .This will include writing their own version of the adventure narrative and other writing purposes such as information reports and postcards.

Maths – In Maths we will be focusing on fractions, time, measurement; including length, mass, capacity and temperature, position and direction, doubling and halving, and quotitive & partitive division.

PSHE- The children will be exploring Growing up, the importance of communication in solving conflict, and exploring our families.

PE – Swimming- The children will be going swimming every <u>Wednesday afternoon</u>, please ensure they have a named swimming bag with swimwear including a swim cap.
