Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to Summer Term. It has been lovely to see our children refreshed and ready to enjoy their final term at All Saints'! Within this term, we have packed in lots of exciting events and opportunities, which we have included in the key dates calendar below.

Our Topics:

History and Geography: We will be starting our learning on Anglo-Saxons and Vikings. Students will tie in their knowledge of key events in Viking and Anglo-Saxon history to their geography knowledge through mapping various areas in the Anglo-Saxon and Viking history and comparing them to how the UK is divided today.

Art: We will be investigating the built environment through drawing and printmaking, learning about the work of architect Zaha Hadid, creatively presenting research on the artist Hundertwasser and exploring the symbolism of monument design.

Science: Our science topic in Summer 1 is Animals including Humans, with a focus on life cycles. Students will look at the characteristics of different stages of the human life cycles, and then explore the gestation periods and life spans of other animals. In Summer, 2, we will be focusing on Living Things and their Habitats. We will be continuing our focus on life cycles but on a broader scale. Students will be looking at the differences between the life cycles of mammals, amphibians, insects and birds as well as explore the life processes of reproduction in plants and animals. **DT:** We will be focusing on cooking this term, whereby students can consider how to follow a recipe and practice the necessary skills and techniques when cooking.

Other learning this term:

English – Linked with our study of ancient cultures, students will be studying Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief in Summer 1. Students will be focusing on writing a non-chronological report and a myth.

Maths – We have a number of focuses in Maths in summer, including perimeter and area, statistics, shape, position and direction, a second unit on decimals (focused on adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing decimals), negative numbers, converting units and volume.

PSHE- We will be talking about puberty and the reproductive systems, emotional states and skills we can use to reinforce friendships. There will also be a focus on transitioning into Year 6.

PE – Students will be participating in athletics as well as striking and fielding sports

Computing – Students will be creating games, constructing 3D models and creating concept maps. **French** – Healthy lifestyles

Music – Melodic and non-melodic percussion and voice and recording. Nigerian drumming, South African choral music.
